9	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: I make the motion,
10	please.
11	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: I second it.
12	MAYOR KALNICK: All in favor?
13	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Aye.
14	TRUSTEE KWIAT: Aye.
15	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: Aye.
16	MAYOR KALNICK: Aye.
17	TRUSTEE TORKAN: Aye.
18	MAYOR KALNICK: For the record, item two on
19	the agenda which we reviewed sets forth the
20	Deposits for the Building Department and the
21	Village.

17	the request for proposal for Independent Audit
18	Services for fiscal years ending May 31, 2020,
19	'21 and '22 have been received.
20	Gomie, do you want to
21	CLERK PERSAUD: Yes, Mayor.
22	MAYOR KALNICK: give us the results?
23	CLERK PERSAUD: We received two proposals;
24	one was from RS Abrams and Company, LLC and that
25	amount came in for the last the fiscal year

1	ending May 31, 2020 is 28,000; and May 31, 2021
2	comes in at 28 800; May 31, 2022, 29,600; and
3	that also includes the village and the Court on
4	it.
5	We received a second proposal from Satty,
6	Levine and it's Satty, Levine, and theirs came
7	in, May 31, 2020, 27,000; May 31st, 2021,
8	27,000; May 31st, 2022, 27,000 but does not
9	include the court audit which they stated will
10	be an additional \$3,750 for each year.
11	So I would recommend that the board pick the
12	lowest bidder which is RF Abrams and Company.
13	MAYOR KALNICK: Gomie, you have spoken to
14	other villages that utilize their services?
15	CLERK PERSAUD: Yes, Mayor. I spoke with the
16	Village of Sands Point, the Village of Flower
17	Hill and I have a call in to the Village of Old
18	Westbury and Village of Rockville Centre, I am
19	waiting for them to get back to me because R.S.
20	Abrams does work for all those Villages and the
21	two that I spoke with are happy with them.
22	MAYOR KALNICK: Very good.
23	Resolution to accept the proposal of R.S.
24	Abrams. So moved?
25	TRUSTEE KWIAT: So moved.

1	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Second.
2	MAYOR KALNICK: All in favor?
3	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Aye.
4	TRUSTEE KWIAT: Aye.
5	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: Aye.
6	MAYOR KALNICK: Aye.
7	TRUSTEE TORKAN: Aye.
8	MAYOR KALNICK: Next item on the agenda,
9	Consideration of the Second Extension Option for
10	the
11	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: Sorry, Mayor, I can't
12	hear you.
13	MAYOR KALNICK: The next item on the agenda
14	is the Second Extension Option for the Garbage
15	Contract for the period June 1, 2020 to May 31,
16	2021.
17	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Right.
18	MR. LIMMER: Mr. Mayor, I understand that
19	there may be some question of whether or not the
20	increased contract price scheduled for the next
21	year might be reduced because of the sharp
22	reduction in gas prices and I suggest that if
23	the board wants to proceed with that, that it
24	does it on the basis giving the mayor the
25	authority to seek a reduction in the increase in

1	price based upon his negotiations with the
2	contractor, and unless the contractor can give
3	the mayor cause not to reduce the price which is
4	a possibility, that the contractor renews at a
5	lower price if those negotiations can provide
6	that reduction; otherwise if the contractor can
7	provide the mayor with good reason not to reduce
8	the price he would then have the ability at his
9	option to renew the contract at the increased
10	price.
11	A little wordy, but does that get the essence
12	across?
13	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: I believe so.
14	MAYOR KALNICK: Very clear.
15	So moved? Can I have a motion to approve?
16	TRUSTEE TORKAN: So moved.
17	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Second.
18	MAYOR KALNICK: All in favor?
19	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Aye.
20	TRUSTEE KWIAT: Aye.
21	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: Aye.
22	MAYOR KALNICK: Aye.
23	TRUSTEE TORKAN: Aye.
24	MAYOR KALNICK: The last item on our agenda
25	is the Storm Water Management Program Annual

1	Report.
2	MR. LIMMER: The report is obligatory and the
3	people that have been doing it for us have been
4	doing it, my understanding is on a good basis
5	and so that
6	MAYOR KALNICK: Yes, they have done an
7	excellent job in the past, agreed.
8	MR. LIMMER: And I think at this point now
9	that the report is final, the mayor, after
10	reviewing the report, agrees that it's
11	appropriate, he should be authorized to sign and
12	submit it as required.
13	MAYOR KALNICK: Can I have a motion to
14	approve to authorize me to sign the report
15	once it becomes final?
16	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: I make the motion.
17	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: I second.
18	MAYOR KALNICK: All in favor?
19	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Aye.
20	TRUSTEE KWIAT: Aye.
21	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: Aye.

24	MR. LIMMER: Mayor, I forgot that there was
25	one other item that I forgot to add to the

1	agenda.
2	The contractor for East Shore Park bought the
3	plant materials and were ready to plant them
4	when they got stopped by the Governor's
5	executive order and they asked if they could
6	because the timing of the payment, the first
7	payment was after those plantings were planted,
8	so right now they are out all that money for
9	purchasing the plants and they wanted to know
10	whether or not they could be reimbursed for the
11	cost of the plants.
12	TRUSTEE HAROUNIAN: Which is how much, Steve?
13	MR. LIMMER: I never got that number. I said
14	it was up to the board to make its
15	determination.
16	They acted in good faith, it's not their
17	fault they can't plant them.
18	(Whereupon there was a discussion held off
19	the record.)
20	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: What are the plants?
21	MR. LIMMER: They have the plants.
22	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: I don't understand.
23	What condition?
24	MR. LIMMER: Could I make this suggestion,
25	that if the plants, if we are advised that they

1	have the plants and they will keep them alive or
2	replace them at their own cost then in the
3	mayor's discretion he would be authorized to
4	approve the requisition for payment.
5	MAYOR KALNICK: Makes sense, yes.
6	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: They have planted few in
7	Bell Cove. Three of them that are very close to
8	me, close to my home, the right weeks and I
9	think they are already dead.
10	MR. LIMMER: They are not planting by you in
11	Bell Cove. This is East Shore Park.
12	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: No, I understand, but it
13	is the same guy, right? Dave Planter.
14	CLERK PERSAUD: Yes.
15	MR. LIMMER: The requirement in this contract
16	is they have to be maintained for three years
17	after the planting so if they plant them and
18	they die, they have got to replace them at their
19	cost.
20	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: We need to know the
21	amount before we accept the risk.
22	MAYOR KALNICK: Also we have to make sure
23	they are going to continue in business and have
24	their staff back in light of what's been going
25	on.

1	MR. LIMMER: Okay. So then let me have them			
2	make a formal request for the next meeting with			
3	that information.			
4	There is a bond. They did have to post a			
5	bond as part of the contract.			
6	MAYOR KALNICK: Correct, but let's make sure			
7	they do it right.			
8	MR. LIMMER: I understand, okay.			
9	MAYOR KALNICK: All right. Very good. I			
10	think that's it.			
11	So a motion to adjourn?			
12	TRUSTEE KWIAT: Mayor, is there the extension			
13	of time that was discussed for a moratorium?			
14	MR. LIMMER: It was agreed that we will wait			
15	until the next meeting.			
16	MAYOR KALNICK: We still have time because			
17	right now it's 30 days after July so we have			
18	time for next month to look.			
19	TRUSTEE NEMATZADEH: For next month. When is			
20	our next meeting?			
21	MAYOR KALNICK: To be determined subject to			
22	what is happening obviously and the Governor's			
23	orders that may come out in the interim hearing.			
24	So we will advise, certainly advertise on our			
25	website for the next meeting that's uncoming.
